Getting to know you . . . and each other Meet Kerri-Jo Hansen

Kerri-Jo Hansen has many passions in her life. In addition to her 23-year-old son Louis, she is devoted to elementary school teaching, child development, genealogy, the U.S. Air Force, hand embroidery and the Episcopalian faith.

Kerri-Jo describes herself as an "Air Force brat". Her father retired from Castle Air Force Base in Atwater, Calif., when she was 16. As an "Air Force brat" she had lived in Okinawa, Japan; Weisbaden Air Base in what was then West Germany; and Osan Air Base in South Korea. She went with her Girl Scout Troop to see the Berlin Wall. Her family took a family trip through Europe in 1975 touring the Dachau Concentration Camp and the Canterbury Cathedral in England at a time when the cathedral was refurbishing its stained glass windows. Her cross has pieces of ancient glass from the stained windows. She also visited the DMZ in South Korea in 1994.





After receiving her bachelors of arts degree in child development, Kerri-Jo worked as a training and curriculum specialist and later as an assistant director at several Air Force Child Development Centers. She then turned to her dream job --- teaching --- and has been an elementary school teacher since 1996.

Volunteerism is very important to Kerri-Jo. She is a member of Sons of Norway and recently became vice president of her Norseman Lodge. And, for the past two years she has helped decorate floats for Pasadena's famed Tournament of Roses Parade.

"Christianity seems to be in my DNA," Kerri-Jo says. "I

can trace ancestry baptisms in the Church of England as far back as the 1500s. My family has Quaker roots and we are direct descendants of Quaker minister John Edward Wilbur." Kerri-Jo was raised as an Episcopalian, which has been a significant part of her family for five generations. Her commitment to the church is strong as she has served as an acolyte, a member of a choir and served on the vestry at churches in the U.S. and Germany. She serves as a St. Francis lector, a lay eucharist minister, and is the newest member of St. Francis' Bishop's Committee.

In addition to finding St. Francis "wonderfully spiritual" she says the people in St. Francis' family are "friendly and I enjoy the conversations at coffee hour."
